## **TALMUD TORAH 7:6**

**6.** If someone was under \*Nidui\* for thirty days and did not ask to for the ban to be lifted, we declare a second \*Nidui\*. If he sat [in \*Nidui\*] for another thirty days and [still] did not ask for the ban to be lifted, we put him in \*Herem\*.

Q1: Why is the \*Menudeh\*'s lack of interest in getting the ban lifted cause for another ban?

**HH:** If he had repented, he would have asked for forgiveness.

**YE:** Just to add to Harald's words:

A component of the violation which led to \*Nidui\* was attitudinal - towards the sages and/or the community (see our posting at TT 6:14, Q8). If the \*Menudeh\* is unmoved by the ban, such that he doesn't care enough to be reintegrated into the community \_and\_ reaccepted by the sages - that is a continuation of the same negative and destructive attitude that led to the first \*Nidui\*.

**Q2:** If he is not concerned or moved by being in \*Nidui\* - how will a second \*Nidui\* or \*Herem\* be any different?

**HH:** Repentance needs time. Besides, the punishment of being cast out from the community becomes more and more painful as the separation lasts longer and longer.

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
